VOLUNTARY CURTAILMENT RIDER

Availability

This rider is available in all territory served by Southeastern Indiana REMC, hereinafter referred to as the Cooperative, subject to the Cooperative's Service Rules and Regulations. To qualify for this Rider, the Member must be billed pursuant to Southeastern Indiana REMC's Industrial Power Service tariffs (IPS) and has in place individual Member metering which meets all the requirements of the Cooperative's Industrial Power Tariff. The Member shall be responsible for the cost of any metering equipment required or necessarily upgraded to receive the benefits provided by this Voluntary Curtailment Rider.

Applicability

Applicable to Members which have a minimum monthly 30-minute demand of 500kW. The Member must register by April 1 of each year for service under this Rider. However, registration does not require Member to curtail its load unless the Member accepts the curtailment pricing levels and hours of curtailment offered by Southeastern Indiana REMC. Hoosier Energy, power supplier to Cooperative, may act as agent for Southeastern Indiana REMC in making a curtailment offer to Member. Furthermore, failure to accept an offer will not disqualify the Member from participating in future curtailment offers.

Effective Date

This Rider shall become effective on March 1, 2009 and shall remain in effect until revised, amended, or otherwise changed by Southeastern Indiana REMC Board of Directors.

Description of Service

Under this Rider, on behalf of Southeastern Indiana REMC, Hoosier Energy may request that the Member voluntarily curtail its electrical service at any time and for any reason. Hoosier Energy will contact the Member no less than one (1) hour prior to a curtailment period and will specify the number of hours of curtailment that Hoosier Energy is requesting for a period of up to 12 hours. Hoosier Energy will offer the Member one of three pricing levels, as determined by Hoosier Energy on a case-by-case basis for each specific individual curtailment period, to curtail some or all of its electrical energy usage. Curtailment by the Member is not required unless the Member accepts the price offered and the number of hours of curtailment sought by Hoosier Energy. There shall be no penalty if the Member does not curtail its electrical usage, therefore not accepting Hoosier Energy's offer to curtail.

Curtailment Prices

The Member will receive a credit based upon the difference between the Member's actual measured demand at the 30 - minute interval immediately preceding Hoosier Energy contacting the Member requesting the curtailment and the actual maximum 30-minute interval during the curtailment period. This difference will be multiplied by the number of hours for the curtailment

period and by the curtailment pricing level accepted by the Member. This credit will be provided pursuant to the monthly Southeastern Indiana REMC billing statement.

Pricing Level A	\$0.15 per Kilowatt
Pricing Level B	\$0.25 per Kilowatt
Pricing Level C	\$0.40 per Kilowatt

Terms & Conditions

Unless otherwise modified herein, all other charges, terms and conditions of Southeastern Indiana REMC's Industrial Power Service (IPS) tariffs shall remain in full force and effect.

This Rider will not impact in any way or cause adjustments to be made to the minimum demand requirements and/or power factor requirements/adjustments as defined in the tariff to which this Member is assigned and billed.

This Rider or any part thereof, may be revised, amended, or otherwise changed from time to time by the Southeastern Indiana REMC Board of Directors. This Rider shall supersede and replace any previous Voluntary Curtailment Rider used by Southeastern Indiana REMC.

Southeastern Indiana REMC and Hoosier Energy will exercise reasonable care and diligence to supply service continuously and without interruptions but does not guarantee continuous service and shall not be liable for any loss or damage resulting from interruption, reduction, delay, or failure of electric service.

System Emergencies

In the event of a system emergency, the Member may be required to interrupt all or part of their load. A system emergency is a condition that would threaten the system reliability of Southeastern Indiana REMC and/or Hoosier Energy. If Southeastern Indiana REMC or Hoosier Energy declares a system emergency and the Member has already accepted an offer from Hoosier Energy pursuant to this Rider, the Member will continue to receive compensation pursuant to this Rider. However, if Southeastern Indiana REMC or Hoosier Energy declares a system emergency and the Member has not already accepted an offer of voluntary curtailment from Hoosier Energy pursuant to this tariff rider, the Member will receive no compensation.
